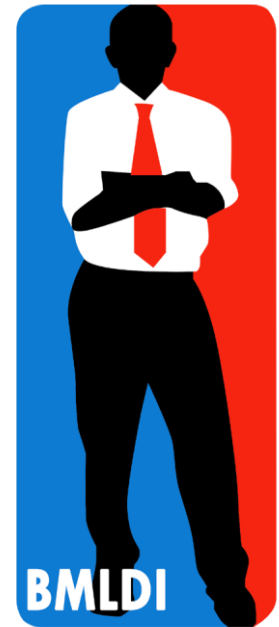

The **Black Male Leadership Development Institute (BMLDI)** is a program that brings African American boys, in grades 9-12, together in a year-long program designed to increase educational and leadership opportunities for the selected participants. BMLDI allows African American young men to take the competencies that they already have and expand them into a repertoire of leadership skills that can have a practical impact in their local communities. This is done by creating a supportive learning community that offers a challenging curriculum and rich set of activities that enhance their awareness of themselves and the world around them. Through the program, they will acquire leadership skills that can help change the outcomes for African American men and boys in this region.

BMLDI, which is co-sponsored by the Urban League of Greater Pittsburgh and Robert Morris University (RMU), kicks off with a week-long Summer Residential Summit on the RMU campus and is followed by mandatory year-round programming that consists of Saturday Institutes, Guys' Night Out Sessions and BMLDI service projects. All components of BMLDI are staffed by a faculty consisting of African American leaders from the region and beyond, whose diverse backgrounds span the range from the pulpit to the boardroom.



WHAT PARTICIPANTS GAIN FROM BMLDI

- Network of positive and relatable African American role models
- Leadership experience
- College and career preparation
- A safe and empowering space for open dialogue

NOTE: BMLDI is offered FREE of charge to students who are accepted. The costs for the Summer Summit, Saturday Institute, and Guys' Night Out sessions have been underwritten through grants and generous in-kind donations – the dollar value of the experience is approximately \$3,000 per student.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- African American male
- Entering grades 9, 10, 11, or 12 (as of August 2019)
- Maintenance of adequate school attendance (at least 85% present)
- Preferred yearly cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher (from 2018/19 school year). Students with a lower GPA may be considered on a case-by-case basis and will be required to submit a letter of recommendation
- Residents of the Greater Pittsburgh region

WEEK-LONG SUMMER RESIDENTIAL (RMU MAIN CAMPUS)

BMLDI kicks off with a week-long residential summer summit on the RMU campus. The summer summit will take place from Sunday, June 16, 2019 to Saturday, June 22, 2019 **Selected participants must stay the entire week.**

Throughout the summer summit, participants engage in:

- Workshops concentrating on topics such as values clarification, identity formation, and visioning
- Leadership exercises, which include the media's portrayal of African American manhood, fatherhood and personal accountability
- Dinner sessions with keynote speakers and community leaders in the Pittsburgh region

The sessions are designed to inspire and motivate the participants, as well as to provide a venue for African American male role models to share their stories. The evening hours consist of fun activities and entertainment to suit every interest.

SATURDAY INSTITUTES (RMU DOWNTOWN CAMPUS)

Saturday Institutes occur once a month and consist of workshops facilitated by African American male leaders with expertise regarding issues that have a significant impact on the African American community (particularly males). In previous years, some of the themes featured in the workshops have revolved around college and career readiness, physical mental and spiritual well-being, and measuring performance and accountability. These workshops build upon each other throughout the year and will instill in the participants skills, which will be of use to them in many different settings and for the rest of their lives.

GUYS' NIGHT OUT SESSIONS (URBAN LEAGUE OF GREATER PITTSBURGH)

Twice a month students meet for informal evenings during which they engage in discussion and activities centered around areas of common interest. The topics covered can include personal growth, peer pressure, diversity, and life as a young adult. While these sessions are intended to build upon the leadership workshops received during the Saturday Institutes, the environment is also aimed at creating a positive break from the stressors of school.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is mandatory. Students enrolled in the BMLDI are expected to arrive on time and attend all sessions during the summer summit, as well as the year-round programming. If attendance becomes inconsistent, participant disenrollment from BMLDI may become necessary and is determined at the discretion of BMLDI staff.

BEHAVIOR

BMLDI maintains a safe environment wherein all are to be respected and rules and regulations exist to keep activities fun and beneficial for everyone. The BMLDI, the Urban League of Greater Pittsburgh, and Robert Morris University have a **Zero Tolerance Policy** for bullying, use of drugs and/or alcohol, violence, threats of any kind, theft or any other disruptive behavior. Any behavior that is unbecoming of BMLDI standards could result in permanent removal from the program; this decision will be made at the discretion of BMLDI staff. Rules and regulations will be reviewed in their entirety during the mandatory BMLDI orientation session detailed in the chart above.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation to the Robert Morris University (main campus) will be provided on Sunday, June 16th from the Urban League of Greater Pittsburgh downtown office. Parents and guardians are invited to the end of the week celebration at RMU on June 22nd and may take their son home with them upon conclusion of the celebration. If parents/guardians are unable to attend the celebration, transportation back to the Urban League of Greater Pittsburgh (downtown office) will be provided for student
